•The DLR grievance was recently resolved with the signing of a letter of release/settlement in which the former member received a lump sum payment from the company.

! The spring National Representative Council meeting of TNG Canada/CWA takes place in Sudbury from March 31 to April 2. ONG delegates will be Lois Kirkup, Gord Holder, Debbie Cole and Tony Cote.

! CWA: Ready for the Future – This process was a very interesting exercise for the ONG. Our Local has never really taken the time to evaluate our strengths and weaknesses and list the challenges we might be facing over the next few years. We learned we are fairly good at communicating what is happening to the membership, but we sometimes don't promote our successes very well. A short summary report of our views about CWA and TNG Canada's future role was submitted to CWA.

! In response to a strike appeal from the Ontario Federation of Labour, the Guild sent a strike donation to Local 1072, Carpenters' Union, (Woodbridge, ON), locked out by their employer since December 2005.
